## INSTRUCTOR

Khatchig Mouradian is the Coordinator of the Armenian Genocide Program at the Center for the Study of Genocide and Human Rights at Rutgers University, where he also teaches in the history and sociology departments as adjunct professor. Mouradian is also the recipient of the first Hrant Dink Freedom and Justice Medal (2014) of the Organization of Istanbul Armenians.

Mouradian has been actively involved in genocide and human rights education, delivering more than two hundred lectures and presentations in high schools and colleges nationwide since 2008. Mouradian has lectured extensively overseas, including in Armenia, Austria, Cyprus, Lebanon, Norway, Switzerland, Syria, Turkey, and the United Arab Emirates.

Mouradian is a PhD Candidate at the Strassler Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies at Clark University, currently completing his dissertation, titled "Genocide and Humanitarian Resistance in Ottoman Syria, 1915-1917."

Mouradian was the editor of the Armenian Weekly from 2007-2014.
