The St. Leon Armenian School 2021-2022 term has started off with a flurry of excitement and dedication. At the church's Open House in September, many new families registered students from age four and up. Yes, we have started a Pre-Kindergarten class! Also, we welcomed back former students and the virtual students from last term.

September 17 was our opening day but new students can register any Friday. We offer a three-session trial period to make a final decision. Interested? You will find us starting each session with prayer by Der Diran and announcements by our principal, Nora Balekji. Then the students go off to classes in the education rooms both under the church and in the Youth Center. Classes are augmented with dance lessons, singing Armenian songs, and culture lessons. Students learn about the history, geography, famous Armenians in the culture lessons. At the end of the session, students and teachers gather again in the Jessourian Hall assembly area under the church to sing our school song, our Armenian National Anthem, and say our ending prayer along with Der Diran. We follow all the Covid 19 precautions the church recommends. All areas of use are sanitized before and after use.
