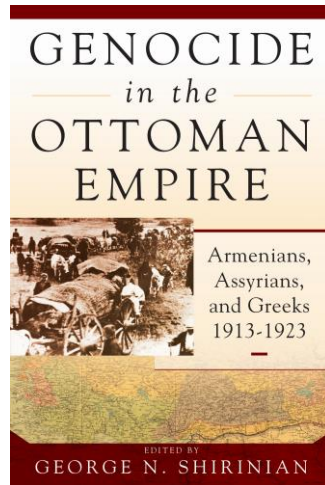


# GENOCIDE IN THE OTTOMAN EMPIRE

## ARMENIAN, ASSYRIANS AND GREEKS 1913-1923



### PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION WITH EDITOR GEORGE N. SHIRINIAN

From 1913 to 1923, the Ottoman Empire deported, killed, or otherwise persecuted staggering numbers of its non-Turkish, non-Muslim citizens, setting a modern precedent for how a regime can commit genocide in pursuit of political ends while largely escaping accountability.

While this brutal history is most widely known in the case of the Armenians, few appreciate the extent to which Assyrian and Greek subjects suffered and died under similar policies.

*Genocide in the Ottoman Empire* is the first comprehensive volume to broadly examine the genocides of the Armenians, Assyrians, and Greeks in comparative fashion, analyzing the similarities and differences among them and giving crucial context to calls for recognition.
