
## Kristapor Cara-Murza by Krikor Pidedjian



## Introduction by Special Guest Şahan Arzruni

Explore with musicologists **Krikor Pidedjian** and **Şahan Arzruni** the life and work of a notable figure in the evolution of Armenian national and liturgical music.

**Kristapor Cara-Murza** was arguably the first composer to introduce homophony or chordal music to Armenian music and the first to form mixed gender choirs that brought Armenian men and women together to sing as a group.

Krikor Pidedjian and Şahan Arzruni will place the work of Cara-Murza in historical and social contexts and bring to life exchanges with personalities of the time, such as Khrimian Hairig. They will share new discoveries, including a Divine Liturgy composed by Cara-Murza that was found by Krikor Pidedjian and Cara-Murza's connection to *Mer Hayrenik*.

The presentations promise to be lively and engaging. Krikor Pidedjian is a noted conductor, composer and author. He will speak in Armenian. Şahan Arzruni is an accomplished pianist, composer, writer, producer and recording artist. His presentation will be in English.
