


Do you know what the writing above the altar says?

Jesus and the Samaritan Women- Jesus is heading back to Galilee from Jerusalem. Jesus chooses to go through Samaria although he did not have to. The encounter that Jesus has with the Samaritan woman takes place at Jacob's well. Jacob is a common ancestor for the woman and Jesus and the wells are the place for Weddings (Betrothal) in the Old Testament. In the Gospel of John, Jesus is the bridegroom the Samaritan women represents the Church (God's people) which is made up of sinners (Isaiah 62:5, Jeremiah 2:2, Hosea 2:16-20, Rev. 19:6-8:21:9-10. Jesus being the bridegroom is also God. Although Jews did not interact with Samaritans, Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for water. She couldn't understand how Jesus being a Jew is asking her for water. Jesus begins to explain to her that if he knew who is asking for water, she would ask him for the water that Jesus gives which the water of life everlasting. Jesus continues to point out her sins and she leaves convinced that Jesus is Prophet. Jesus is the true light which enlightens all people with the living water. In the Gospel of John, we are called to believe in him, testify to the ways he brings abundant life to everyone, and we are invited to come and see for ourselves as the Samaritan women does as she goes back to her community and tell the people what happened. Jesus' ministry in Galilee emphasizes "Repent for the Kingdom of God is at hand", which is shared throughout the Gospels. Jesus affirms the fulfillment of the scriptures in Luke 4:16 which is met by the people of the synagogue with anger and rage. Despite his rejection, Jesus continues his ministry in Galilee where he does great works.

By receiving the sacrament of baptism in the Armenian Church, we are all members. However, per the bylaws of our diocese, membership is further understood as those who annually pay dues to a specific parish.

A dues-paying member is one who takes responsibility for offering their service for the spiritual and financial growth of our parish and in the advancing our Diocesan Christian mission.

"The mission of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church is to preach the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and to proclaim its message of salvation. This mission is realized through worship, education, witness, service, and the common life in Christ as expressed in the distinctive faith-experience of the Armenian people."

Further, dues-paying members are eligible to participate in the governance of our parish by voting at the Parish Assembly and may run for office in any of the executive bodies of the various organizations of the parish, including the Parish Council.

The St. Leon Parish Assembly has designated the following amounts as the required minimum dues for St. Leon Parish Membership. Please consider becoming a dues-paying member & contribute as generously as the Lord leads you.
