

For the Next Bible Study

We will continue with Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan Women. John 4:1-42

John's Testimony to Christ- Chapter 3: -22-28: Why is John the

Baptist brought into the narrative at this point? It highlights the consistent faithfulness of John the Baptist witness to Jesus. John does not deviate in his mission even though some of the disciples have now begun to follow Jesus. The dispute about purification between John's disciple and the Jews had been an ongoing debate. Here it is brought up again. What was the meaning, of the spiritual efficacy, of John's baptism? Was it really different from the Jewish cleansing by water? Where did John receive the authority to baptize? Out of this discussion, a statement is thrown at the Baptist that surely could have been viewed as jealousy. This must have come from John's own disciples, for they address him as "Rabbi". They speak of One who was with John beyond the Jordan to whom he bore witness. Surely, Jesus, whose name is not mentioned here. must have been in the company of the John longer they we assume. Then these disciples report, "He is baptizing, and all are coming to Him!" John the Baptist reiterates what he has so emphatically stated before, "I am not the Christ, but I have been sent before Him." (v.28) The relationship between God and His people is often spoken of as bridegroom and bride in the Old Testament. (Hos. 2:19) But Jesus now has come as the bridegroom in this new age to claim the new Israel as His bride. It is John the Baptist "the friend," who has introduced and turned over some of his disciples, "the friend," who has introduced and turned over some of his disciples, the new "bride," to Jesus the new "bridegroom." But those who reject this gracious gift, who will not believe, have turned away from life. The alternative to life in Jesus is death and darkness. "the wrath of God".





How do we understand membership in the Armenian Church?

By receiving the sacrament of baptism in the Armenian Church, we are all members. However, per the bylaws of our diocese, membership is further understood as those who annually pay dues to a specific parish.

A dues-paying member is one who takes responsibility for offering their service for the spiritual and financial growth of our parish and in the advancing our Diocesan Christian mission.

"The mission of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church is to preach the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and to proclaim its message of salvation. This mission is realized through worship, education, witness, service, and the common life in Christ as expressed in the distinctive faith-experience of the Armenian people."

Further, dues-paying members are eligible to participate in the governance of our parish by voting at the Parish Assembly and may run for office in any of the executive bodies of the various organizations of the parish, including the Parish Council.

The St. Leon Parish Assembly has designated the following amounts as the required minimum dues for St. Leon Parish Membership. Please consider becoming a dues-paying member & contribute as generously as the Lord leads you.
